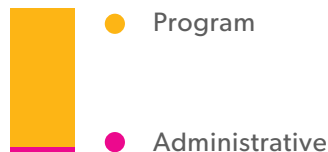

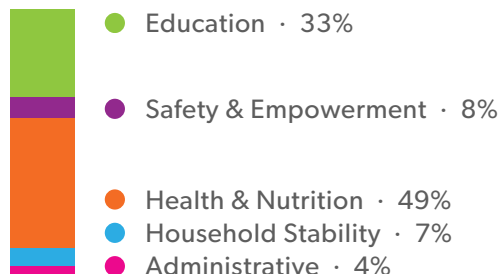
WE ENVISION A COMMUNITY THAT IS EQUITABLE, JUST, AND PROSPEROUS FOR EVERYONE.
